It teaches prevention education, trains professionals, and raises organizational consciousness on the community and legislative levels in order to create social change to end this violence. It annually serves approximately 5,000 victims and educates, trains, and outreaches to nearly 10,000 individuals residing in Eastern Fairfield County, CT (Bridgeport, Easton, Fairfield, Monroe, Stratford and Trumbull.)

The Center for Family Justice is recognized as the region's primary provider of services and resources during crisis and transition for those impacted by domestic and sexual violence. Direct services include individual counseling and support groups for women and children; bilingual domestic violence and sexual assault emergency hotlines; and legal, medical, housing and employment advocacy. We offer an emergency shelter for those fleeing violence in the home, as well as a parenting education program for adults, with corresponding children's support groups.
